Spontaneous Procedures

In-Person Competition Procedures



Who Will Compete:

ALL team members (up to 7) are encouraged to participate. This will apply to verbal, verbal/hands-on, and hands-on problems.



Verbal and Verbal/Hands-on Problems:

There will be a limited number of TEAM responses. Responses will be tracked using "tokens" that are randomly scattered on the table to start the problem. "Tokens" could be plastic discs, poker chips, coins, etc.



Giving Responses:

Team members will select a token, place it in a container, and give a response. Team members may respond in any order. Individual team members may give as many or as few responses as the team wishes.



For ALL TYPES of problems, team members should listen closely to the directions for their specific problem.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE EASTERN REGION DIRECTOR, RANDY BURTON

With the current pandemic, the number of teams competing is much lower than it was previously. In some cases, there could be only one or two teams registered for a given problem and division competition. Since the first and second place teams advance to the NCOM State Tournament, this means that in these cases all of the teams will be eligible to advance.

Regardless of the numbers of teams competing, in order to be eligible to advance to the State Tournament, teams must make a significant effort to solve the long-term problem and must present their solution at the Regional Tournament.

NCOM 2022 COVID-19 Event Protocols

- Tournaments will follow the venue masking and Covid requirements. Please note that currently Wake County requires *all persons to be masked at all times*. We've gotten some questions about masks that allow for playing wind instruments and those are currently NOT allowed. While this could change before March teams should prepare for the most restrictive rules
- Following CDC recommendations, the wearing of face masks will apply to ages 2 and older.
- We encourage all students, coaches, volunteers, parents and supporters participating in the program—and are eligible—to be vaccinated for the COVID virus OR have a negative COVID test within the 72 hours prior to attending an event.
- Participants will social distance whenever possible.
- If you are experiencing symptoms related to COVID-19 (or any infectious disease), do not participate or attend tournaments/events until you are symptom-free for 48 hours.
- At tournaments/events, any individual who is not wearing a mask inside event buildings:
 - 1. Will be asked to wear a face mask.
 - 2. If they refuse, they will be told to leave the building.
 - 3. If they refuse, school security will be summoned.
 - 4. If they refuse, the Long Term or Spontaneous presentations will not be started until the individual is properly wearing a mask or leaves the building.
 - 5. The team associated with the individual who refuses to wear a face mask or leave the building may be assessed up to a 10-point Unsportsmanlike Conduct penalty.
- Our desire is to have as many people observe the long term problem solution presentations and award ceremonies. The number of spectators allowed to watch may be limited and adjusted based on room capacity and social distancing efforts. Priority seating will be given to immediate family members, school administration and friends.

We are hopeful that these preventative measures will be short-lived. We want to provide a safe environment for all OMers—our children, coaches, parents and volunteers. Thank you in advance for your support and cooperation.



40 YEARS OF ODYSSEY OF THE MIND IN NORTH CAROLINA!

Odyssey is all about creativity, so I thought we should start with the Ranatra Fusca Award. The Ranatra Fusca Creativity Award represents the essence of Odyssey of the Mind. It is presented to teams or individuals who exhibit exceptional creativity, either through some aspect of their problem solution, or an extraordinary idea beyond the problem solution. A successful problem solution is not a criterion for winning the award; rather, the award is a way to acknowledge and encourage creative thinking and risk-taking.

Ranatra Fusca is the term for a classification of water insect. Although this may seem a remote association to creative thinking, the name has a special meaning in Odyssey of the Mind. Odyssey of the Mind was born from a college class taught by its founder, Dr. Sam Micklus, in which he assigned students to create a flotation device to transport them across a pond. One student designed a water strider-like contraption. The device did not solve the problem because of its inability to maintain proper balance; however, if given the time and opportunity to "go back to the drawing board," the student would have been able to correct this and cross the pond. Even though the device did not work properly, the idea was exceptionally creative.

Teams that earn a Ranatra Fusca Creativity Award at the state/province/country level of competition are eligible to advance to World Finals. If an individual is awarded a Ranatra Fusca, the entire team advances. Ranatra Fusca winners at the World Finals level receive a medal and have their team name engraved on the Ranatra Fusca trophy. This has been a tradition since 1981, and the trophy is on display each year at World Finals.

With the help of Odyssey HQ, I searched through Odyssey of the Mind Summer newsletters (there were a few missing years) and identified North Carolina individuals and teams that have been awarded a Ranatra Fusca at World Finals. As you can see, there have been a creative bunch of people at all ages and all across the state. Who knows, maybe you or your team will be added to the list!
